### **BET YOU DIDN'T KNOW...**

#### **NEIL ARMSTRONG LEFT HIS SHOES ON THE MOON!**

After Neil Armstrong took one of the most consequential steps in human history, the boots he used to do so were discarded on the moon. In fact, both of the Apollo 11 astronauts who walked on the lunar surface — Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin — left behind their overshoes, along with their portable life-support systems. Leaving the gear wasn't a symbolic gesture; it helped to offset the added weight of collected moon rocks that the shuttle would be taking back. And the astronauts didn't return to Earth barefoot, either. The treaded overshoes they abandoned were worn atop flat-soled pressure boots, which they kept.

#### WHEN DID MOTHER'S DAY BECOME **AN OFFICIAL U.S. HOLIDAY?** ANSWER: 1914

Holding celebrations to honor mothers is traceable back to the ancient Greeks and Romans. They held annual festivals in honor of the mother goddesses Rhea and Cybele. The celebration closest to modern times that may have spawned what's become traditional Mother's Day is the early Christian celebration known as "Mothering Sunday." The holiday originally fell on the 4th Sunday in Lent in the U.K. and parts of Europe. The custom faded over time eventually re-emerging in

popularity as the American Mother's Day in the 1930s and 1940s. It was officially declared a U.S. holiday in 1914, however.

#### **BUTTERY SHRIMP WITH PEAS & POTATOES**

May 10th is National Shrimp Day!

Creamy new potatoes add substance to this quick one-pan skillet dinner of tender shrimp, fresh shelling peas, and dill, which come together in a sweet and buttery broth laced with cream.			200

#### Directions

• 1/4 cup unsalted butter

- Bring 5 cups water to a boil in a 12-inch skillet over medium-high. Stir in 2 tablespoons salt. Add potatoes; cook, stirring occasionally until barely tender, 5 to 7 minutes. Using a slotted spoon, transfer to a plate. Add peas to boiling water; cook, stirring occasionally, until crisp-tender, 2 to 3 minutes. Remove skillet from heat. Drain peas in a colander; rinse under cold water until cool to the touch, about 15 seconds. Set aside.
- 2. Wipe skillet dry using paper towels. Add butter and oil to skillet; cook over medium-high until butter is melted. Add shallot, chile, garlic, and 1/2 teaspoon salt; cook, stirring often, until mixture is fragrant and softened, 2 to 3 minutes. Add wine; cook, stirring occasionally, until wine is almost completely reduced, about 2 minutes.
- 3. Add shrimp to skillet in a single layer; sprinkle with black pepper and remaining ½ teaspoon salt. Cook, undisturbed, until shrimp are partially opaque, about 2 minutes. Flip shrimp, and immediately add broth and potatoes to skillet. Bring to a simmer over medium-high; simmer, stirring occasionally, until shrimp are almost cooked through, about 1 minute. Add peas and cream; cook, stirring occasionally, until heated through, about 30 seconds. Remove from heat. Season with additional salt and black pepper to taste. Sprinkle with dill and serve with crusty bread.

## CAN I LET SOMEONE BORROW MY CAR?

Whether it's a friend in a jam or a family member visiting from out of state, drivers borrow each other's cars all the time. But what are the implications for your insurance coverage? Here's what to ask before letting another driver head into the sunset in your vehicle—or before driving someone else's car.

1. If they're visiting from out of state, you don't need to worry. If they have a driver's license from another country. check your state's requirements the driver may need to apply for an International Driving Permit before he or she arrives in the U.S.



- 2. Does the borrower have a good driving record? If they have a history of fender benders and you keep your vehicle in pristine condition, it's OK to not hand over the keys.
- 3. Is my insurance up to date? Every state requires a minimum level of auto insurance coverage, and some stipulate that in case of an accident, the car owner's auto insurance not the driver's—provides primary coverage. (So if the driver rear-ends someone or bumps another car in a parking lot and your insurance has lapsed, you could be liable for damages.) Depending on your state's regulations, you may also want to verify whether the driver has his or her own car insurance.
- 4. What do they plan to use the car for? If it's any kind of commercial activity, like driving for a ridesharing program, you'll need to check your auto insurance policy. Again, in many states, the car owner's auto insurance provides primary coverage. If the car is being driven for commercial purposes and you only have a personal policy, you may not have sufficient coverage.
- 5. You should also ask if they plan to drive the vehicle into Canada or Mexico. Customs officers are often on the lookout for stolen cars, so you may want to provide the driver with a letter stating they're authorized to take yours across the border.
- 6. Will the borrower use the car regularly? Your newly licensed teenager may phrase it as 'borrowing' the car, but if they're using it to go to sports practice or the mall every weekend (and live in your household), you should add them to your insurance policy as a regular user.
